- Previously used equipment items are ok, but must be the proper size and quality.

## **Troop 267 Patch Placement Guide**

<u>Note:</u> there is a patch placement guide on 22 - 23 of the Scout Handbook. The information below on patch placement has been taken from the Scout Publication "Insignia Guide" (No. 33066B.)

1) Council Shoulder Patch ("CSP") "Theodore Roosevelt Council" (yellow background): this patch is sewn on the LEFT sleeve, just below the shoulder seam.



2) Unit Numerals: this patch is sewn just below and nearly touching the CSP.



3) Patrol Emblem (tan circle): this patch is sewn about ¼" below the American Flag which comes pre-sewn to the RIGHT sleeve of a new uniform. Two examples are below.

- 4) World Crest: (purple and white circle): this patch is sewn so that it is centered horizontally above the LEFT pocket, and centered vertically between the LEFT shoulder seam and the top of the pocket.
- 5) 1910 World Crest Ring Emblem (fits around the World Crest)



- 6) Rank Patches: (when earned) are centered on the LEFT pocket, below the button. Be sure not to sew the pocket closed.
- 7) Arrow of Light: (for those boys that earned it) Centered and IMMEDIATELY below the left pocket.
